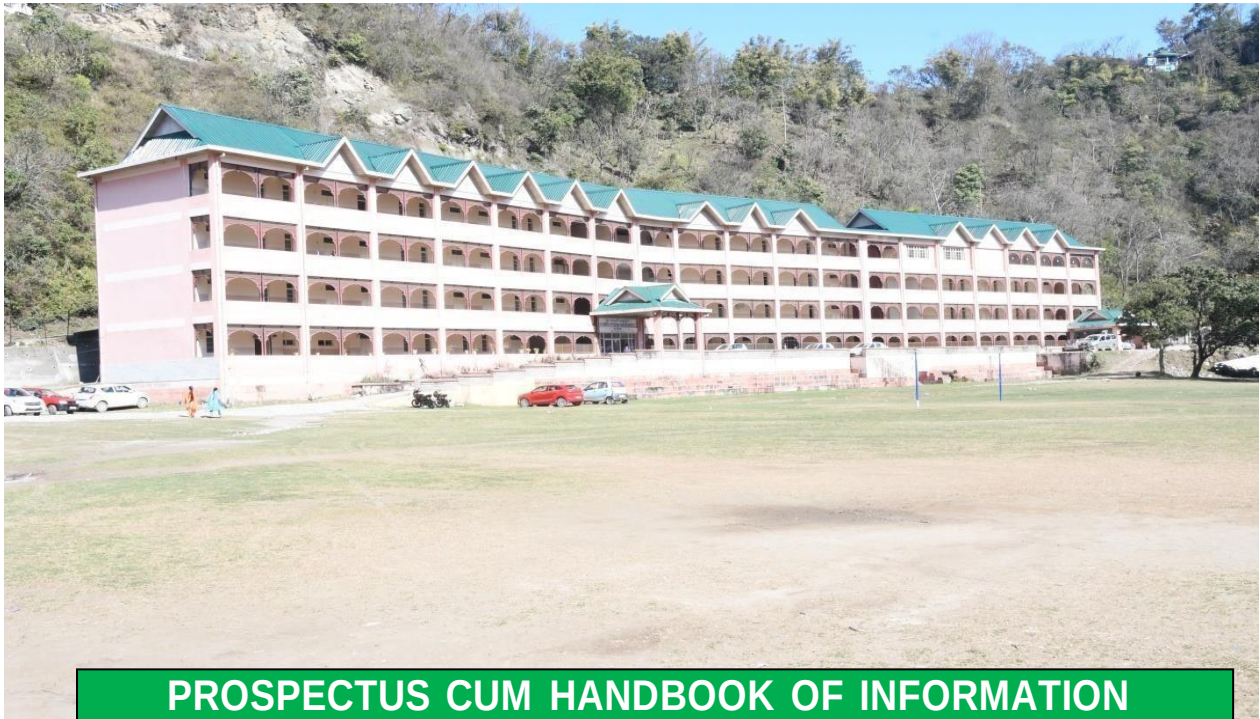

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PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

ADMISSION SCHEDULE:

Submission of Admission Forms to UG.1st Year on Merit bases:01-06-2025 to 19-06-2025.

(No admission form will be entertained after this in any case except there is statutory admission)

Admission to 2nd& 3rdYear (Roll on basis): 01-06-2025 to 19-06-2025.

ADMISSION UNDER CBCS (UGC):

The Govt. of Himachal Pradesh has introduced Choice Based Credit System under UGC and these regulations have been called the HPU Regulations for CBCS and Continuous Assessment Grading Pattern (CAGP) for UG Programs.

DEFINITIONS:

Credit: It is a method/unit to measure the volume of the content, learning effort, achievement of learning and weight age of the course. The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course usually. In terms of instructional hours per week assigned to it for the purpose of credit determination. One lecture or tutorial of one hour a week and practical of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total minimum credits required for an undergraduate degree programme i.e. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(annual system) 132.

Tutorial Session Consists of participatory discussion/desk work/ problem solving/ brief seminar on a topic or any such other novel method that makes learners absorb and assimilate more effectively the contents delivered in a lecture session. Normally, the tutorial sheets prepared by the teacher are distributed in advance to help learner prepare for interaction systematically.

Practical / Practice session consists of hands-on experience/ laboratory experiments/ Field Studies/Case studies that equip students to acquire the much-required skill component

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): Continuous comprehensive assessment shall be carried out in the form of quizzes, assignments, group discussions, seminars, 1 class test/house exam and annual examination and shall be reflected in the syllabi for a course of study.

Course Offered in the College: B.A. with Core Course-I in various subjects; B.Sc. with Core Course-I in various subjects and B.Com with Core Course-I in Commerce.

Eligibility for Admission:

1. A student pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education (or in case of *Shashtri*, pass in *PrakShashtri* from Sanskrit Colleges affiliated to the SPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the SPU.
2. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
3. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.

4. An applicant should not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl students only) as on 01/07/2025. The upper age limit is raised to 26 years for SC and ST applicants. However, in case of overage applicant, the Vice Chancellor, SPU may allow a relaxation up to 6 months.
5. An applicant having passed 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Board/University recognized by H.P Govt. or SPU or Association of Indian Universities can seek admission.
6. Admission is also open to an applicant who has an equivalent degree from Foreign University/ Board/College which is recognized by H.P. Govt. or SPU or Association of Indian Universities provided the applicant fulfils the minimum eligibility conditions.
7. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidate.
8. Initially all admission shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by S.P. University.
9. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the S.P. University notifications issued from time to time.
10. Admission to the various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
11. Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/affidavit on plain paper as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.
12. The applicant must fill up the Application Form in his/her handwriting and get it signed by his/her parents/local guardian.
13. The Application Form must be completed in all respects along with the following documents:
 - a. Self Attested copies of detailed marks card of the previous examinations passed. In case of non- receipt of this certificate, the applicant must attach the certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b. Self Attested copy of Matriculation certificate for verification of date of birth.
 - c. Original Character certificate from the institution last attended.
 - d. Self Attested copy of Aadhar Card.
 - e. Bonafide Himachali Certificate in case of Girls candidates.
 - f. Every applicant must fill an Anti Ragging Undertaking online on the link <http://www.antiragging.in> of UGC and an Anti-Drug pledge/affidavit.
14. Applicant must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
15. Applicant coming from various Boards/Universities must provide migration certificate in original.
16. Persons with Disability (PwD/Divyangjan) applicant seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate not less than 40 % disability from a Medical Board.

Note: Applicants who will submit the self-attested copies of the certificates regarding SC/ST/OBC/EWS/IRDP/PwD etc. will be eligible to get the benefit of these categories. Otherwise, no benefits under these categories will be given to the applicants.

RULES OF REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. Applicants who have passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Samelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar are not eligible for admission in the first year for three-year degree course. However the admission can be done if allowed by DHE/SPU Mandi (HP).
2. Any candidate who passed his/her 10+2 examination after the month of July every year is not eligible to take admission in 1st year in that particular year.
3. Any candidate who appeared in or passed his/her 10+2 examination without English as a subject shall not be eligible for admission in first year for three-year degree course.
4. In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during the previous years.
5. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission without assigning any reasons.

MIGRATION:

The migration of students migrating during the same course/session from any affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

Choosing Programme Study Courses in CBCS under UGC:

1. At the time of admission each student will identify a **Core course -I(main)** subject in which he/she will concentrate and two other core **courses-II & III (allied)** subjects, which he/she would choose to study.
2. **Core course-I** once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and joins a new programme.
3. **Core courses-II & III**, on the other hand, would be the subjects that would be chosen by the student out of a number of subject combinations (at least two subjects) suggested and approved by the UG BOS and Faculty and these courses should be available in the college/institution in which student applies for admission.
4. In these courses the student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of credits in order to qualify for the UG degree.

For the Degree:

1. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College for a period not less than three academic sessions (and not more than five academic sessions), should have passed the examinations prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have been prescribed there for.
2. For the degree (B.A. / B. Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission, provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.
3. The minimum pass marks for all the courses in CBCS (UGC) system for both CCA and ESE/ Annual Exams (A.E.) will be 35 per cent in each and 40 per cent in aggregate.

Duration (Time Frame):

The UG (TDC) programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate. There shall be in each session not less than 180 working days with 1080 teaching clock hours (each working day having 6 teaching clock hours).

3. B.Com. (Commerce)

All commerce papers.

Intake Capacity:

- The maximum number of seats in each core course-I will be 80. The number of seats maybe enhanced to 140 if the number of teachers in any subject will be more than one.
- The admission to the core course-I will be done on the basis of the merit. Provided thenumber of applicants will be more than the intake capacity in any course.

1. Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses - (I-II Year) =12 papers.
2. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) -(I Year)=02 paper).
3. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) -(IIInd Year & IIIrd Year.=04 papers).
4. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-I & II) Courses- (IIIrd Year= 04 papers for Arts & Commerce.and 06papers for Science).
5. Generic Elective Courses (GEC)-(IIIrd year = 02 papers only for Arts & Commerce.).

Accumulation of Credits:

A student **must accumulate** 132 credits for new pattern for the award of a UG degree.

Evaluation:

Evaluation system has the following two components:

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):-It will account for 30% of the final grade in a phased manner.

- **Class Room Attendance:** A student has to attend a minimum of 75 percent lectures/tutorials and practical failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear in ESE/annual exam. The incentive for classroom attendance is as under:-

75% but <80%	1 mark
80% but <85%	2 marks
85% but <90%	3 marks
90% but <95%	4 marks
95% & above 95%	5 marks

- **House Exams (HE):** There will be one HE in each year and it will be of 15 marks for Science and 10 marks for Arts and commerce for all Years.
- **Class Test (CT):** There will be one class test for Arts and Commerce of 05 marks in each year.
- **Seminar / Assignment / Quiz/Project** –The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of class test/ seminar / assignment / quiz /project or field work etc.

Annual Exams (AE): The remaining 70 percent of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of annual exams (AE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Grading:

- **Credit Weighed Marking System:** Performance of a student is evaluated in terms of earned credit weighed marking system. Earned credits are defined as the sum of course credits in which grade points above a certain cut off have been obtained for declaring learner pass in that course. In this way two performance indices emerge:
- **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)** for the current semester which is calculated on the basis of grade points obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory or course continuation has been awarded. $SGPA = \frac{\text{Points secured in the semester}}{(\text{credits registered in the semester excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses})}$.
- **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** for the student is calculated on the basis of all pass grades obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory or course continuation has been awarded, obtained in all completed semesters
- $CGPA = \frac{\sum(\text{course credits earned } (C_i) \times \text{Grade points } (G_i)) \text{ over all semesters}}{\sum(\text{Total course credits } (C_i \text{ in all the semesters except satisfactory, audit credits or course continuation credits})}$ Or $CGPA = \frac{\text{cumulative Points secured in all passed courses}}{(\text{Cumulative earned credits excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses})}$.

- **Calculation of Grades for SGPA and CGPA** The marks obtained in the CCA and the ESE/annual exam will be combined and used for the deciding of the course grade that the student will be getting. Grading will be done by the Office of the COE SPU for each course class and the grades will be assigned to the students in the class as follows:

- Category XIII (Incomplete, with letter grade I) is given to students who are unable to complete the programme and are considered 'dropped'.
- Categories XIV and XV (Audit Pass with letter grade P and Audit Fail with letter grade X) are given to the students who are auditing (attending the class, but not for grade) the course and are passing or failing respectively. These grades will not be counted for determining the Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulated Grade Point Average (CGPA) of the student.

For determining GPA, SGPA and CGPA, Division and Merit positions for Medals etc.

For each student the Grade Point Average (GPA) and the Cumulated Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be determined by the CoE office of the SPU as follows: $SGPA = (\sum C_i G_i) / (\sum C_i)$ Where i is summed over the number of courses studied in the current semester. GPA or $CGPA = (\sum C_i G_i) / (\sum C_i)$, Where i here is summed over the number of courses studied in the past semesters as well as current semester. Where, C_i is the credit earned for course i (i varying from 1 to n) and G_i is the grade point obtained by the student in course i (i varying from 1 to n), n being the number of courses passed so by a student.

LEAVE RULES:

- Leave up to 3 days will be sanctioned by the Tutor and from 4 to 6 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
- Leave application after prolonged illness (more than 6 days) must be accompanied with medical fitness certificate and will be sanctioned by the Principal.

DISCIPLINE AND RAGGING:

- Discipline is essential to maintain the academic atmosphere in the college. Any student found creating indiscipline including ragging in the college shall be punished under rule framed by SPU.

- Ragging is strictly prohibited inside and outside the college right from the time of beginning of the session/admission and is punishable offence according to the **Hon'ble Supreme Court orders dated 04-05-2001, 16-05-2007 and 11-02-2009 and notifications of UGC, New Delhi** from time to time.
- Himachal Pradesh University has framed the rules followed by SPU Mandi also vide Notification No. 1- 14/HPU/DSW/08/360Dated10-07-2008 and as per these rules - Any student found involved in ragging will be punished appropriately which mayinclude:
 - Expulsion from the college/university.

“Ragging” means the following:

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of fresher or a junior student.
